

Hi all, a bit of a story of a pair of wedge tail eagles I recently observed. As most of you know I work at Burnie High School (well I get paid to be there anyway) and for many years we have had a pair of WTE frequent the hills behind the school, recently I observed one of the birds with what I thought was a snake in its claw flying around on closer viewing I realised it was a large stick maybe 4 foot long and guite thick then all of a sudden it exchanged the stick with the other WTE in mid air and they did this 3-4 times before I lost sight of them behind a stand of gums. I'm still in awe of this and thought wow what have I iust witnessed. Fast forward 2-3 weeks I'm working out back of school and I see said pair of WTE fly

around over head so I



started watching them and noticed both birds carry sticks in their beaks and flying down into a gum about 50m from me so I investigated a bit closer and discovered a nest being built in the fork of a large gum they brought in branches and leaves smaller ones in their beak and larger ones by claw I also observed them breaking off branches with their beak and carting to nest.

So I'm not sure if I am witnessing something that not many humans have seen before but believe me I have witnessed something I believe to be pretty special and as I said the nest is about 50m from a school and houses I will keep you updated and hopefully I see some chicks fledge in the near future. Tribute from Lorna Dicker Vale Graeme McNamara 25.11.1936 -10.08.2024

Have you ever met someone for the first time and that image stays with you for the rest of your life? I first met him about 1975 when I visited my Mum and her friend, who was his Uncle. A battered flat tray ute arrived and this person got out. He was wearing a fawn bib & brace dungarees with one side hanging down undone, a blue flannel checked shirt and muddy boots. Then I looked up and I saw the biggest smile and mop of unruly curls on his head. This was Graeme McNamara! I can still see him today!

I join the North West Bird Club in 1992 and enjoyed hearing about the start of the Club Room, the way he built it and about the old Members who were there from the start. He had so much knowledge on the health and safety of bird care he could have written quite a few books on the subject, but he preferred to talk! Having been on a farm Graeme could also mend, repair and design anything, from small household repairs, large gates to gigantic sheds. He could weld, saw and nail most things. Over the last few years I have had the honour of Graeme's visits for a tea. He would arrive with an armful of home grown vegies (which was his favourite outdoor pastime). He would spend this time telling me wonderful stories of his time Aviary-sitting on the mainland and the people he met. He visited Africa and was excited at meeting the Pygmy children and their families. He loved life and new experiences. When home he loved his little companion Dot who would sit beside him in her basket watching TV. She didn't care if he still had one side strap hanging, still undone, or if he had lost his phone or hearing aid again! But WE will miss you Graeme. Thank you. R.I.P
